FLOOR TILING

The concrete floor slab in hostel 1 was not in good condition, so we decided it would be best to tile it.

Tiles, adhesive and grout were ordered from South Africa and Brass Tacks tiled some of the bedrooms. Later a worker from Sunnybrook was employed on piecework to complete the main lounge, kitchen, corridors and bathrooms. We are pleased with his workmanship.

PLUMBING

It was great to be able to welcome Peter Handsley to Ipusukilo in November to oversee the plumbing installation. Peter had already designed the plumbing layout and came with his wife Christine and their girls who were also involved at Amano Christian School. During his time, Peter worked with Felix and Moses and completed the first fix plumbing in hostel 1 and also a fair amount in hostel 2. Peter was also able to sort out problems with some of the machines such as the mixer and portable generators.



ELECTRICITY & WATER DISTRIBUTION

We have completed the first phase of the underground electricity and water supplies by burying an armoured cable and two water pipes along the road way in front of the five hostel sites. Connections have been made to hostels 1 & 2 and the other hostels can be connected when they are built. The cable will be connected at the generator house and the pipe to the water tower when it's in place. Here, Felix is pouring resin into a cable joint.

GENERATOR & ELECTRICAL ROOM

We are well under way with the generator house which needs to be completed before ZESCO bring in the electrical supply. We hope they will do this in early January, although they are months late on their original promise!

As there are many power cuts, especially at this time of year, there is need of a generator. We have been donated a lightly used, second hand set, for which we are grateful to the Lord.



LANDSCAPING

The area in front of hostels 1 & 2 have been levelled and a layer of black soil added. Before the rains came we planted simba grass along the drainage ditches and banks behind hostel 1 to try and prevent erosion during the rains. This plan worked fairly well, but it was only after the rains started in mid-November that the grass really took off. The areas around both hostels have been planted and we expect good coverage by the end of January.



WATER TOWER AND SLAB

We have asked a local fabricator to construct an 8 metre high water tower for the project. Unfortunately it's running a bit late but we've been able to construct a suitable concrete base for it to sit on. We will have two 5000 litre tanks at the top to supply the hostels, site facilities and garden taps.



BEDS AND MATTRESSES

Herbert who made the external doors, is now making bunk beds for the project. He has nearly completed the beds for the first hostel up at Chavuma, so once we have tested them out, we can get him to make the rest for hostel 2.


We have purchased mattresses for both hostels from a Zambian manufacturing firm who were pleased to give us a discount and free delivery from Ndola!

TITLE DEEDS


